many different backgrounds.




Our children's choir, led beautifully by Nichola & Craig, is a joy for all our community. Their young voices lift our spirits and create such positive liturgies.


Sacramental Preparation Team

Alpha @ Henley ...



The tool we use for evangelisation at Henley Parish. Alpha is a safe place where people come, connect and explore faith. We share a meal, watch a short movie and then chat about faith. The content is designed to engage people from all walks of life and inspire conversation. They explore the big issues of life and faith and unpack the basics of Christian belief, addressing questions like "Who is Jesus?", "Why and how do I pray?" and "How does God guide us?"

We ran two Alphas in 2023. The first began

in February with an average of 30 participants for the 11 weeks.

Two thirds are under 50 years of age.

20% don't identify as Catholic.

50% identify as ONLY attending mass (sometimes, Christmas and Easter).

Our Second Alpha began in Aug with 47 people attending for most of the 10 weeks. We saw an increase in the number of attendees in the Youth category of 20%. However the 30-49 age group was the largest at nearly 35%. Mostly young parents.



Interesting nearly 80% of all guests identify as being Catholic however, most are not attending weekly mass and therefore are our perfect target as an Alpha guest. Alpha is an opportunity to hear from others and contribute your own perspective in an honest, friendly and open space.

We even had our First Ever Alpha engagement!

Pastoral Care

All of us have been called and chosen to continue the mission of Jesus in our world.



During the past year many parishioners have been involved in bringing the presence of Jesus into the lives of others through pastoral outreach particularly to the sick, the frail and the lonely. For example:

- * Each month Mass has been celebrated in three of the nursing homes located in the parish. Additionally, Holy Communion is distributed weekly to the residents of two of these nursing homes.
- * Several times during the past year Mass with the Anointing of the Sick has been held in the parish hall.
- * Each week dedicated parishioners take Holy Communion to thirty housebound parishioners.

Opportunities for our young people (who attend state schools) to meet Jesus and develop a relationship with him were offered. During 2023 five children were prepared for the Sacrament of Reconciliation while eight children were prepared for the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. The parents of all the children involved attended the weekly classes with their child/children over a period of 3 months.

December 31, 2023 The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

"...as the Lord has forgiven you, so you must forgive." - Colossians 3:13
