
Jesus and the disciples are on the way to Jerusalem, as they are for half of Luke. Jesus knows he is on his way to the end – and a beginning!

The closest parallel I can think of, for those of us old enough to remember, is the panic around HIV/AIDS, when it first hit public awareness.

A good question for us to reflect on is – who, or what are our lepers? Who do we shun – and why?

Standard Mental Health First Aid

The Standard Mental Health First Aid course teaches participants how to provide initial support to another adult who may be experiencing a mental health problem or mental health crisis, until professional help is received or the crisis resolves

Course participants learn about the signs and symptoms of common mental health problems in adults, how to recognise and respond to an emerging or worsening mental health problem and the treatments and supports available



Recognise the warning signs of mental health problems in other adults.

Respond in a crisis

Learn the skills to speak openly and accurately about mental health.



Reduce stigma and increase support for adults experiencing and living with mental health problems.

Learn how to apply mental health first aid to adults across a range of commo mental health problems and crisis situations, including:

- · Depression
- · Psychosis
- · Substance use problems
- · Suicidal thoughts and behaviours
- · Panic attacks
- · Non suicidal self-injury
- · Traumatic events

Become an MHFAider

Adults who complete the course become Mental Health First Aiders (MHFAiders), equipped with the knowledge, confidence, and skills to provide someone with mental health information and support when it matters most.

Complete a short assessment at the end of the course to become an Accredited Mental Health First Aider (MHFAider). Accreditations are valid for 3 years.


